
- In this presentation will see 4 moments on the clock and we will learn how to tell the time in each time.

The Hands of Time


- But first, look at the following picture:

The clock has two hands:

- The long hand is the minute hand
- The short hand is the hour hand:




➤ When the minute hand (LONG) is pointing To twelve (12) we read the time as **O'clock**



Example:


It's two o'clock



- ▶ When the minute hand(long) is pointing to three (3) we read the time as **quarter past**



Example:
It's a quarter past four



It's a quarter past seven

- ▶ When the minute hand is pointing six (6) we read the time as **half past**



Example:

It's half past six




It's half past one

- ▶ When the minute hand (long) is pointing nine (9) we read the time as a **quarter to**









Example:

It's a quarter to one
